The dissolution of the monasteries in 1536-40 was the biggest land transaction in England apart from the Norman conquest.


Also described are the Orders of monks and nuns, their charity, chastity and business acumen or lack of all these attributes. There is also a full county list of every monastery recorded at the disso-

lution in England, the income of each and an

estimate of the land held. Benedictine Glastonbury was top with 130,000 acres. Once Thomas Cromwell and Henry VIII found out the massive wealth of the monastic estate from the *Valor Ecclesiasticus* in 1535, they wanted these assets and were not too scrupulous as to how they got them.
