The file `yorklingmathesis.tex` provides a \LaTeX class for masters dissertations in the Language and Linguistic Science department. The file itself is based on J. Pickering's `YorkThesis.cls` with some tweaks. If you want to use it you should download it and put it somewhere in your \LaTeX path (in the same folder as your thesis will also do). There is some documentation inside the file and you should look at it to see the different commands that it makes available. Some of these commands will not be relevant to masters dissertations. The one feature you need to know about is how to create the cover page (which is very easy). First you need to provide the following information after `\begin{document}`:

```
\title{Your Title Here}  
\author{Your name or exam number here}
```

Do not include the date.

Then you need to issue two commands. The first will depend on the programme you are in and it will be one of the following (these commands have no arguments):

- `\mal` if you are in the *MA in Linguistics*
- `\map` if you are in the *MA in Psycholinguistics*
- `\mass` if you are in the *MA in Syntax and Semantics*
- `\mapp` if you are in the *MA in Phonetics and Phonology*
- `\mas` if you are in the *MA in Sociolinguistics*
- `\mapd` if you are in the *MA in Phonological Development in Childhood*
- `\msc` if you are in the *MSc in Forensic Speech Science*

then you must issue:

```
\titlepage
```

And you are done. This will insert the relevant text and the date at the bottom of the title page (month/year). Here is an example:

```
\documentclass{yorklingmathesis}

\begin{document}

\title{Adjunction as an optical illusion}
\author{Wolfgang Jung}

\mass

\titlePage

\end{document}
```
