Preface

This catalogue has its origins in a small database which I created from the shelflist of the Milnes Walker Collection in the J.B. Morrell Library of the University of York, partly as an exercise in database management, and partly to give to a historian colleague a handlist of the collection. As my knowledge of the collection grew, I decided to put flesh on the bones of the existing database (if I can be excused the metaphor) as and when my leisure time allowed, and the result is the catalogue and its indices which follow.

As ever, I am greatly indebted to my colleague, Mr. Bernard Barr, who put at my disposal his encyclopaedic bibliographical knowledge and, in particular, helped me with such Greek as there is. He also looked over the whole catalogue and made many helpful suggestions for its improvement. Miss S.M. Hutchings, of the Libraries & Information Services of the City of Wakefield Metropolitan District Council, kindly informed me of the location at Wakefield of the *Rules and catalogue of books of the Wakefield Medical Library* and John William Walker's account of the Walker family.

Introduction

The Milnes Walker Collection (hereafter MWC) in the J.B. Morrell Library of the University of York comprises 198 medical works which were donated by Professor Robert Milnes Walker over a period of fifteen years between 1966 and 1983.¹ In a letter to the University Librarian of the time, Mr. Harry Fairhurst, dated 4 March 1966, Professor Milnes Walker outlined the history of the collection and his reasons for the gift.²

I have in my possession a number of early medical books which originally came mostly from the old Medical Library in Wakefield, and which my father bought when that library was sold about 50 years ago. As I am shortly moving to a smaller house I must dispose of many of them, and I feel that they should go back to Yorkshire.

The bulk of the collection was given in 1966, after which there were two further donations in 1982 and 1983, respectively; on this last occasion the gift consisted of the books by Mercurialis and Hippocrates (catalogue numbers 120 and 82 respectively).

The history of the Medical Library to which Professor Milnes Walker alludes is not clear, but enough is known to sketch its likely history.³ There is in the Local History Library of Wakefield Libraries and Information Services a copy of a catalogue of the Wakefield Medical Library of 1872 with manuscript additions to 1888;⁴ Rule 1 states

That the property of the Wakefield Medical Library, consisting of Bookcases, Books, Periodicals, and works of general Medical Literature, belonging to the Society, is now, and shall continue to be, vested in the Committee, for the time being, for the management of the Clayton Hospital and Wakefield General Dispensary, in Trust for the use, and subject to the management of such of the Medical Practitioners in Wakefield and the neighbourhood as shall be members of the said Library, and who shall continue to pay regularly their annual subscriptions to the same.

Given that 'the Dispenser ... [kept] the Library key' (Rule 10) it would seem that the Library was housed in the Wakefield General Dispensary. (The Clayton Hospital was founded in 1854 by Thomas Clayton and incorporated with the Wakefield General Dispensary, which had been established in 1787.) One work in the MWC (catalogue no. 87), with a date of accession of 1 October 1816, formerly belonged to the Wakefield Medical Circulating Library; two other works in the MWC bear the bookplate of the

Wakefield Medical Library (catalogue nos. 114 and 147), to which Library another work (catalogue no. 1) possibly belonged. Hilary Marland has noted the existence from 1830 to the mid-nineteenth century of the Wakefield Medical Book Club,⁵ but its connections, if any, with either the Wakefield Medical Circulating Library (which antedates it) or the 'Medical Library in Wakefield' (which postdates it) are obscure.

Many of the works in the MWC have ink numbers, written on their fly-leaves or on their title-pages, which form the two sequences below. (In the second sequence the numbers in brackets are those of the entries in this catalogue.)

The numbers would seem to be in a hand of the first half of the nineteenth century, but it is unclear whose. This sequence could have been imposed on the books by the 'Medical Library in Wakefield' (which according to Milnes Walker was the provenance of most of his donation); but interestingly neither of the two books which have the Wakefield Medical Library bookplate has an ink number. The sequence shows that the books with ink numbers had probably at one time been arranged by height; those with ink numbers from 3 to 19 inclusive are all 34 cm. in height or above; those with ink numbers 29 to 53 inclusive are between 20 cm. and 26 cm. in height; those with ink numbers 54 to 104 inclusive are between 16 and 22 cm. in height; those with ink numbers 105 to 160 inclusive are between 12 cm. and 20 cm. in height; and those with ink numbers 170 to 248 inclusive are between 20 cm. and 22 cm. in height. There are two sequences which show a subject grouping: ink numbers 168 and 170-174 are pharmacopoeias, while ink numbers 246-248 are books on midwifery.

Approximately two thirds of the books in the collection bear the marks of ownership of John William Walker, the father of Professor Milnes Walker. John William Walker was born in 1859, the son of Thomas Walker, a Wakefield surgeon, and was educated at Rossall School and University College Hospital, London. He joined his father in medical practice in Wakefield in 1883 and was honorary Surgeon to the Clayton Hospital for more than thirty years; he retired in 1920 and moved to the south of England, where he died in 1953.⁶ John William is best remembered as author of several major works on the history of Wakefield, and as president of the Yorkshire Archaeological Society. Four works belonging to him (catalogue numbers 48, 89, 152, and 198) have what I have designated his Bookplate 2; the remainder has what I have designated his Bookplate 1.⁷

Robert Milnes Walker was born in 1903 and educated at Oundle School and then at University College Hospital, London, as his father before him. He was Honorary Surgeon at the Royal Hospital, Wolverhampton, from 1931 to 1946 and then Professor of Surgery at the University of Bristol from 1946 to 1964.⁸ Of those works bearing a direct association with him, catalogue nos. 139 and 159 are prizes which he won while at University; the others, catalogue nos. 33, 47, 73, 136, and 148, are signed presentation copies.

The chronological spread of the MWC covers a period of almost 450 years and the breakdown by century can be seen below;⁹

over half the works in the Collection date from the eighteenth century. It is appropriate that the author with the greatest number of works is Hippocrates, the so-called ‘father of medicine’; among other Greek writers on medicine there are works by Aretaeus, usually regarded as next in importance to Hippocrates, Aurelianus, Celsus, Dioscorides, and Galen. Coming to the eighteenth century there are six medical and two botanical works by Hermann Boerhaave, the Dutch physician and botanist, and there are editions of his two most important works, *Institutiones medicae* and *Aphorismi de cognoscendis et curandis morbis*. One of Boerhaave's many distinguished pupils was John Huxham, who is represented by five works, including his classic account of diphtheria, published under the title *A dissertation on the malignant, ulcerous sore throat*. There are five works by Thomas Sydenham, ‘the English Hippocrates’, of which three are from the seventeenth century (though none is a first edition) and two from the eighteenth.

Among the more interesting of the works in collection not already mentioned are the following. Giovanni Battista Morgagni is represented by his *De sedibus et causis morborum* which established his position as the founder of the science of pathological anatomy. A work widely regarded as the cornerstone of modern child care was published by William Cadogan in 1748 under the title *An essay upon nursing, and the management of children*. From the early nineteenth century, *Delineations of cutaneous diseases*, is important for its seventy-two coloured plates; its author, Thomas Bateman, is one of the founders of the study of dermatology. Finally a mention of the large folio anatomical atlas of Albinus, *Tabulae sceleti et musculorum corporis humani*, which contains some splendid plates, and with which is bound Eustachius' *A compleat system of the blood-vessels and nerves ... beautifully engraved on large copper plates*.
