This one-day seminar will provide an introduction to conversation analysis (CA) – as invented by Sacks, Schegloff and Jefferson – and will demonstrate through examples of research in the area and through hands-on work in data sessions, the value of this approach for psychologists. Professor Gene Lerner is one of the world's leading conversation analysts, well-known for his work on “face” in interaction, bodily deployment, and the social life of very young children. Professor Celia Kitzinger is Director of the Feminist CA Unit at the University of York. The afternoon data sessions will cover a broad range of topics including: conversations with Alzheimer's patients, the social construction of ethnicity monitoring, working with women in trauma after childbirth, and interactions between very young children.
