# Travelling to York



## By Train

York is on the East Coast Main Line. It takes less than two hours to get to York from London (Kings Cross) by rail. Trains depart every half-hour with at least 25 direct trains each weekday.

Direct rail services run from York to many of the UK's regional centres. York can be reached the same morning from Edinburgh, Glasgow, Birmingham, Bristol, Leeds, Manchester, Newcastle, Nottingham and Liverpool. There is also a direct hourly link to Manchester International Airport.

## The Grange Hotel, York, UK



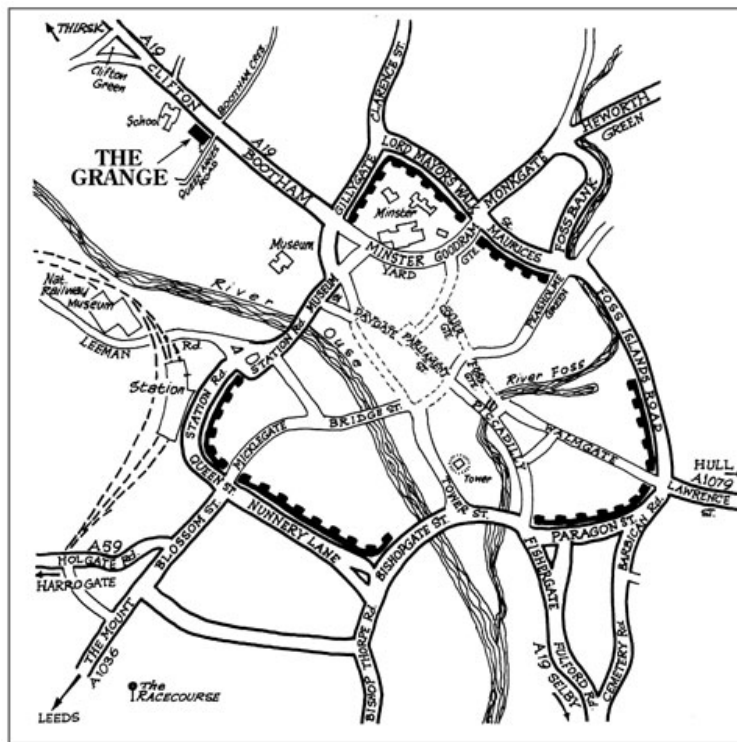
Situated just a short walk from the magnificent Minster, medieval walls and city centre shops, this privately owned, award-winning Regency townhouse is well established as one of York's finest hotels.

A classic Grade II listed property, built circa 1830 for a wealthy member of the York clergy, this smart boutique style hotel offers a relaxed and stylish ambience, luxury accommodation and first-class service.

The Grange is also renowned for its food, particularly the newly refurbished AA 2 rosette awarded Ivy, with its unpretentious approach to top quality dining.

Historic York is a vibrant city with excellent road and rail links to most major towns and cities in the UK. There are frequent rail services to London (2 hours) and Edinburgh (2 1/2 hours) and it is a perfect base from which to explore the beautiful Dales, Moors and Coastline of North Yorkshire.

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The Grange is situated on the A19 York to Thirsk road approximately 400 yards from the City Centre and 2 miles from the A1237 outer ring road giving easy access to the A64, A1, M1 and M62. The hotel car park is at the rear of the building. To access, turn into Queen Anne's Road where the entrance is on your right.

York Railway Station is less than a mile from the hotel. Leave the station concourse and turn left in the direction of the Minster, crossing the River Ouse via Lendal Bridge. At the traffic lights turn left into St Leonard's Place and left again by the Art Gallery into Bootham (A19) and continue for approximately 400 yards. The Grange is on the left on the corner of Queen Anne's Road.
