IC6/008 MATTERS ARISING

IC6/008.1 Smoking shelter screening

Gordon Eastham informed CA that the contractors should be on site within a couple of weeks to locate underground cables.

IC6/008.3 Access to roof glasshouse

Resources Board decided not to proceed with this job. Possible automation of the watering system is being considered which will reduce number of visits required to the greenhouse (although daily visits would still be required).
