06/10 Minutes of previous meeting (16th March 2006) and matters arising:

i) 06/01i Website

The Outreach Website has been updated and a few extra items included. As discussed, JB has now added "Examples of recent outreach activities" page which were agreed to be excellent. Committee members should continue to check the web regularly to make sure all information is up to date and improvements made if necessary.

ii) 06/01ii Introduction to postgraduate students

iii) 06/01iii Bioscience newsletter.

The newsletter is currently waiting to be printed. JBP praised the team behind it for their efforts. We look forward to receiving feedback on the response to the newsletter.

v) 06/02 Discovery days

HMOL reported that the plant structure material produced has been a great success with a huge amount of interest. It was agreed that the ABH material might be of interest to the NSCL and ABH will contact them.

vi) 06/02v National Science Learning centre

JBP gave feedback from the Strategy group meeting he attended. In response to his question whether academics can put in claims for teaching load, a clear NO was given, since people will be paid for any input. JBP also noted that the Head of Department has contacted the NSLC to obtain a summary of the inputs made by Biology staff.

vii) 06/04vi BA Festival of Science

The academic representative for this event is Sean Sweeney. CNAP and UK PopNet will also be submitting proposals for this event.

06/11 **Events Update**

i. Green Apples / Higher Education Academy.

ABH

This event will next take place, provisionally, on 19th June 2006. There will be two activities. Chris Kelly will assist ABH with the DNA fingerprinting and Stuart Priest will run a DNA murder mystery session.

ii. Science Course for non-NAGTY

ABH

This 2 day course for local school children, who are at an equivalent level to NAGTY pupils, took place on 11^{th} and 12^{th} April. ABH informed the committee that all the children who took part really enjoyed themselves. The children took part in various microbiology-based sessions. They also produced posters which were printed out which they used during their presentation to their parents on the second day of the course.

This was a pilot scheme, but since it has been successful, ABH felt that this event could be a lot bigger next year.

iii. **Outreach Log**

Currently, there is just one data log for all outreach and CPD events that people have taken part in. However, the committee decided that it would now be better to have two data logs. One, solely for outreach activities and events, the other for CPD training/workshops/conferences. This was felt to be necessary as CPD activities are separate to outreach work and also teaching credits are unavailable for this type of activity.

iv. Royal Society Grant.

As briefly mentioned at the last meeting (06/08i). TH and ABH TH/ABH helped secure a grant for a Wildlife Pond at the Holy Trinity School in Ripon. TH told the committee she should be making a return visit to the Wildlife Pond on 19th June to monitor the progress. The school is also expected to make a trip to the Biology department on the 15th June.

06/12 **Next Major Events**

i. **NAGTY**

31st July - 11th August. ABH informed the committee that things **ABH** are progressing well in the run up to this event and that requests for people to participate/volunteer etc, have been emailed throughout the department.

ii. **Art of Microscopy**

This event, involving Cannon Lee school will take place on Friday 7th July and will involve a repeat of the successful sessions from last year.
