

Variations to University of York Guide to Assessment for YMP programmes:

- YMP modules provide a maximum of 3 attempts at a given assessment per module in each academic year. This includes the first assessment, the standard reassessment opportunity (should the student fail the module) and a third opportunity for students with approved exceptional circumstances.
- Maastricht only students are permitted to retake failed modules in subsequent academic years (fees will be paid to UM and York compensated for additional teaching load as per the agreed financial compensation model).
- YMP modules are designated as non-compensatable.
- In order to qualify for a lower exit award, 50% of the credit used for the Certificate must be York credit.

The following table sets out which grades will be used for calculating a classification.

For York students - the following conditions should apply to the treatment of marks after reassessment:

A resit mark will appear, uncapped, on transcripts, but will not be used in calculations of merits and distinctions. York will only hold 2 marks - a 'mark deemed as first sit' and any necessary resit mark. Award marks will be based on original 'first attempt' marks. In the event that the credit weighted mean of first attempt marks does not meet the minimum requirement for the award, but all credits were awarded through reassessment, the award mark will be set at the lowest value consistent with passing the award.

For York students only: If it is not possible for a student to achieve the credit required for the intended award by reassessment, the student may be entitled to be reassessed for a lower credit volume award, as appropriate - in order to qualify for a lower exit award, 50% of the credit used for the Certificate must be York credit.

Progression (For York students)

In order to progress to the ISM/Thesis module, students should have been awarded all credits for the taught section either by passing the original assessments or by passing the reassessments. Students who have reassessments outstanding at the start of their ISM are able to start the ISM but do so 'at risk' that if they are not successful at resit, they will not be entitled to submit the ISM.

Assessment

- Students on Maastricht led modules are governed by Maastricht University Education and Assessment Rules for the modules/courses.
- Students on York led modules are governed by University of York Awards, Progression and Assessment Rules with the minor variations noted above for the modules/courses.
