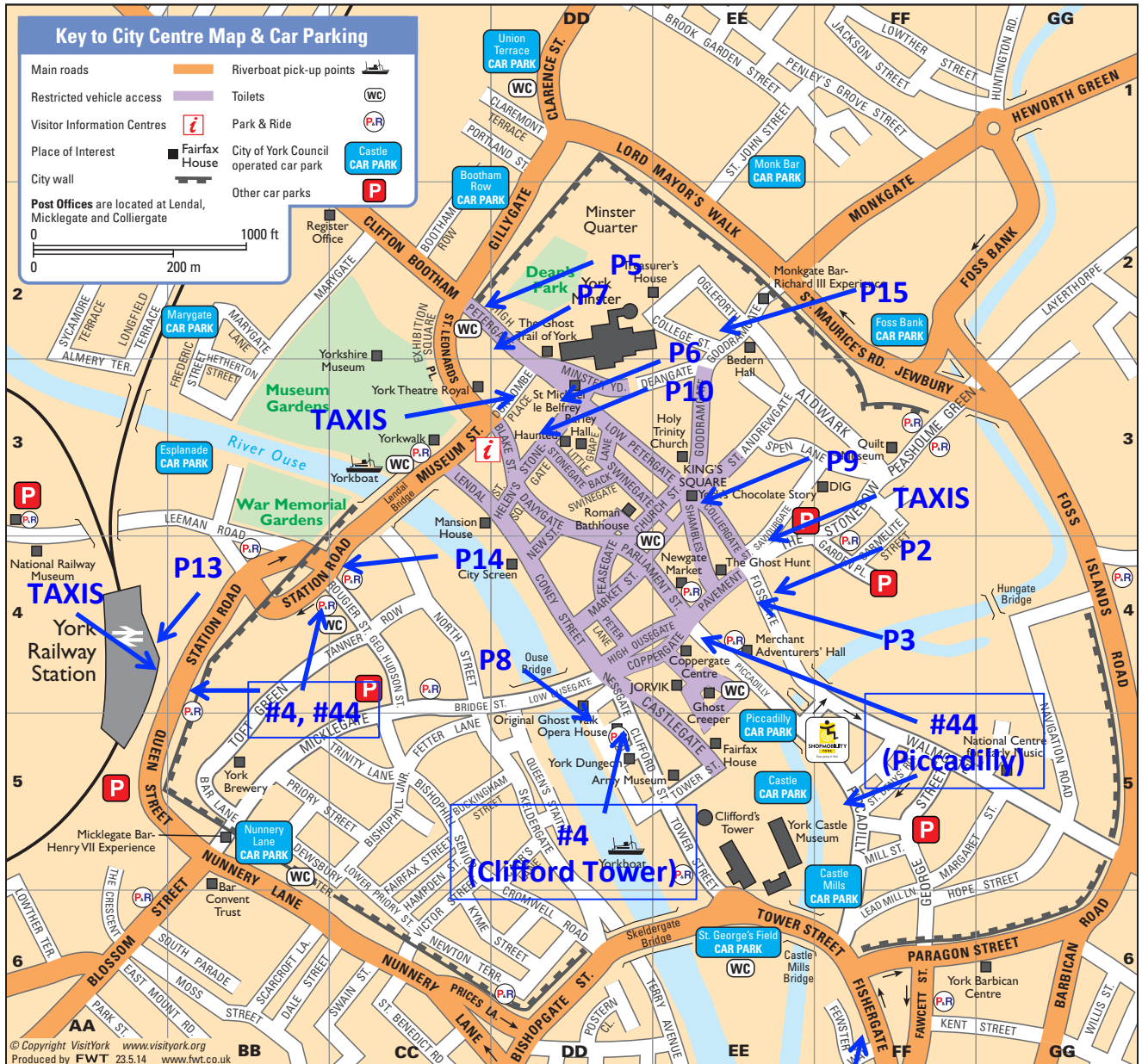


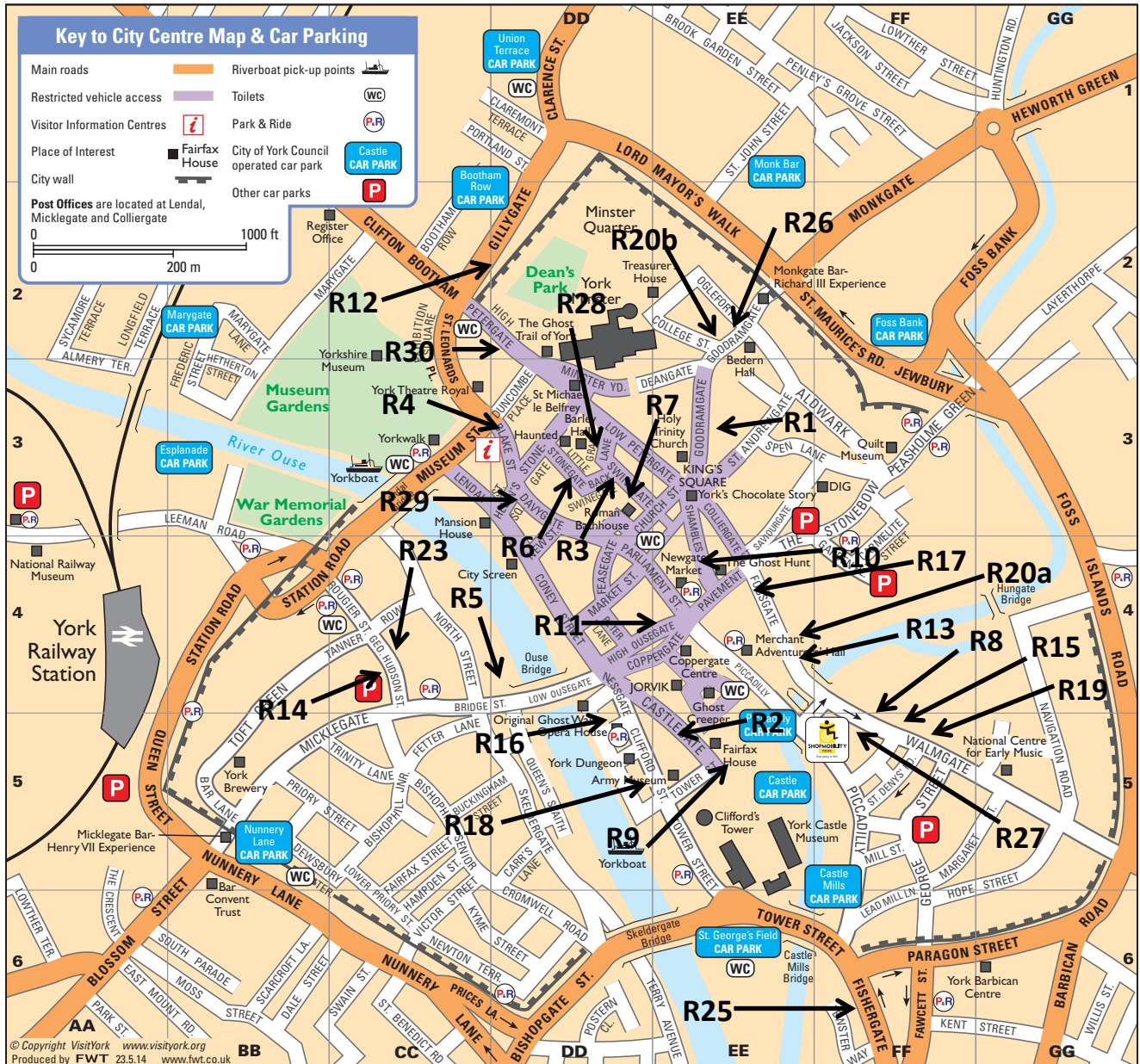

Places to Eat/Drink in York

The places below have been put together as an informal guide by those involved in the conference to help delegates who do not know the city. They are in random order.

None of the listings should be considered as a recommendation, but the chances are that if the pub or restaurant is listed then someone has been there and enjoyed the experience. There are many others to be sampled – York is blessed with a range of such establishments – and there are some of the national/international chains, too. Note that the term 'Indian' restaurant is normally a catch-all that covers food from India, Pakistan and Bangladesh.

With just a small number of exceptions, all are within the city walls. Reference in brackets refers to the location square on the maps provided.

York is a busy tourist city and so if you want to eat in a particular restaurant then we advise that you make a reservation. Few of the restaurants are very large.
