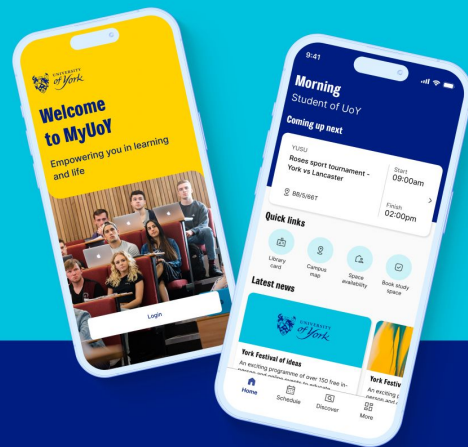
The basics

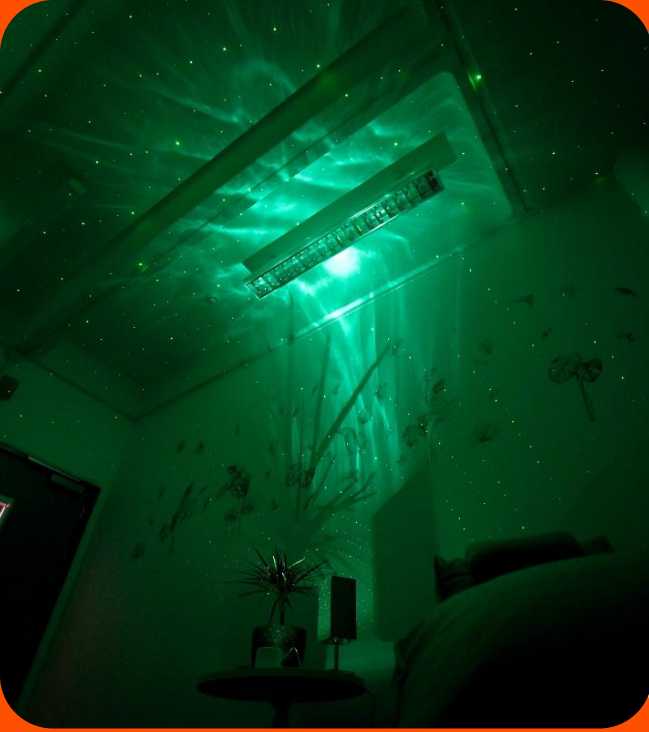

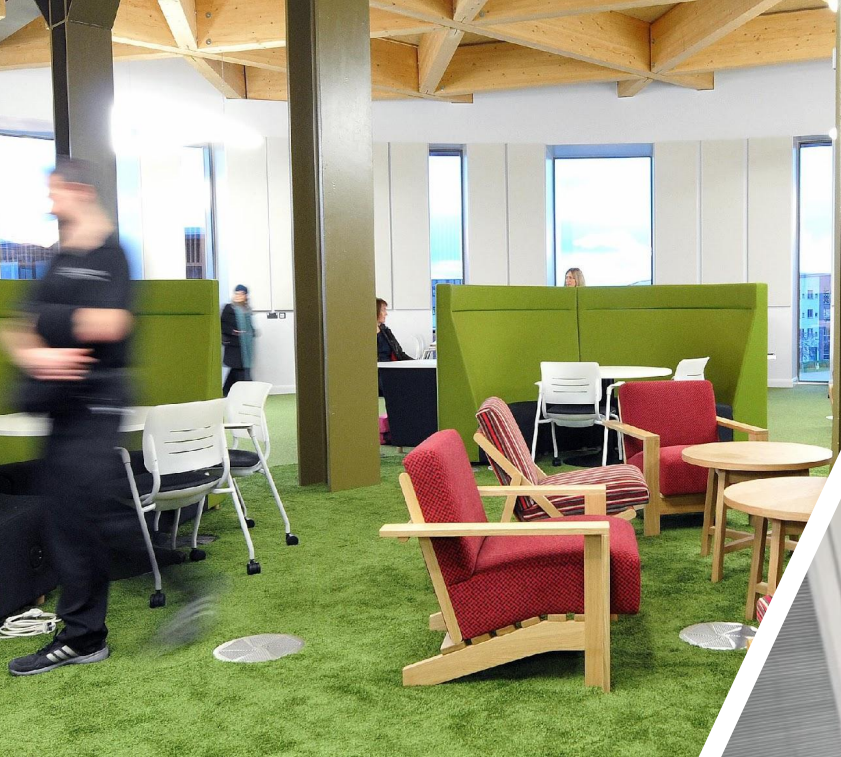

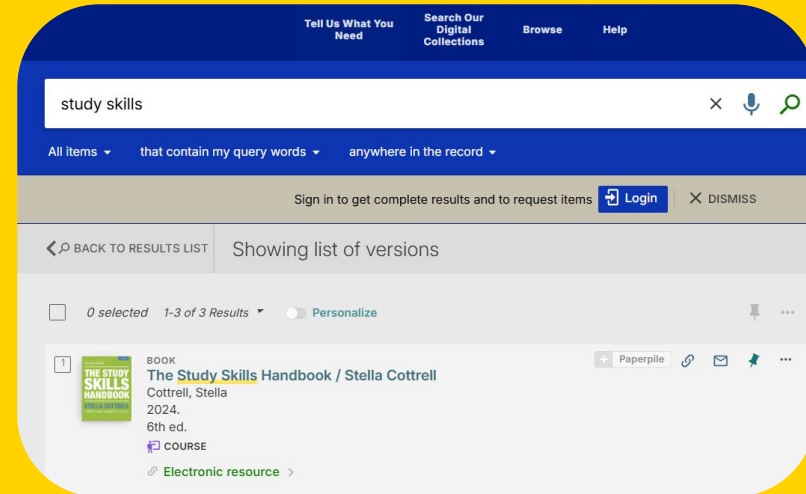

The record provides a link to any electronic copies and also lists what print copies we have in the Library.



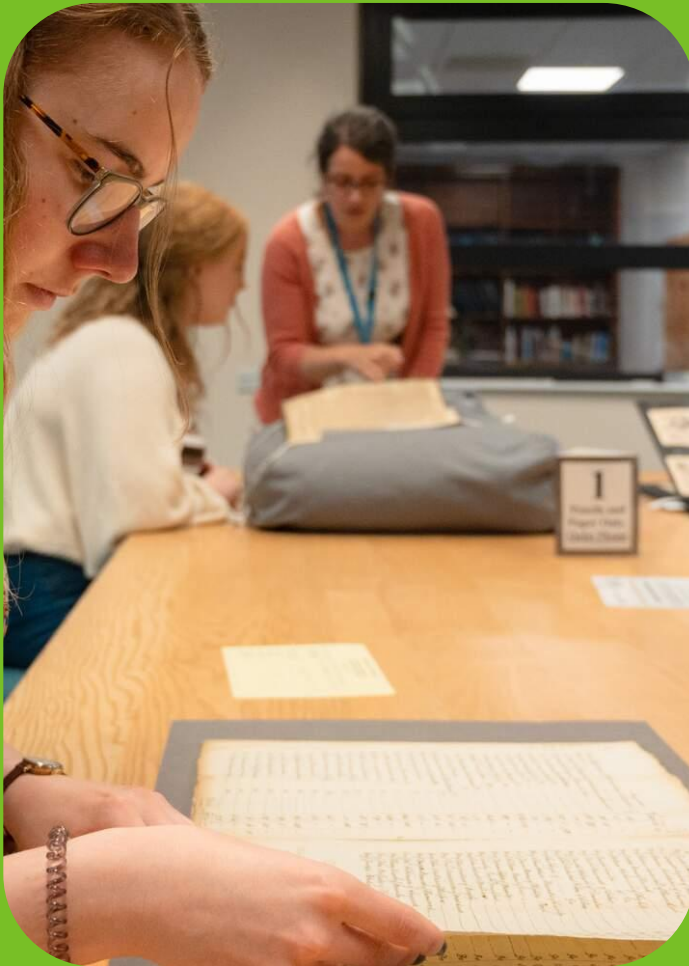


Our online digital skills sessions are usually recorded, so even if you can't make an event it's still worth signing up to get the materials!

Archives and Rare Books

The Archives are open to anyone with an interest whether it relates to your subject or not!

950 cubic metres of archives covering 1,000 years of history, and 35,000 rare books onsite. Plus c.90,000 early printed books at York Minster Library, the largest Cathedral Library in the country.

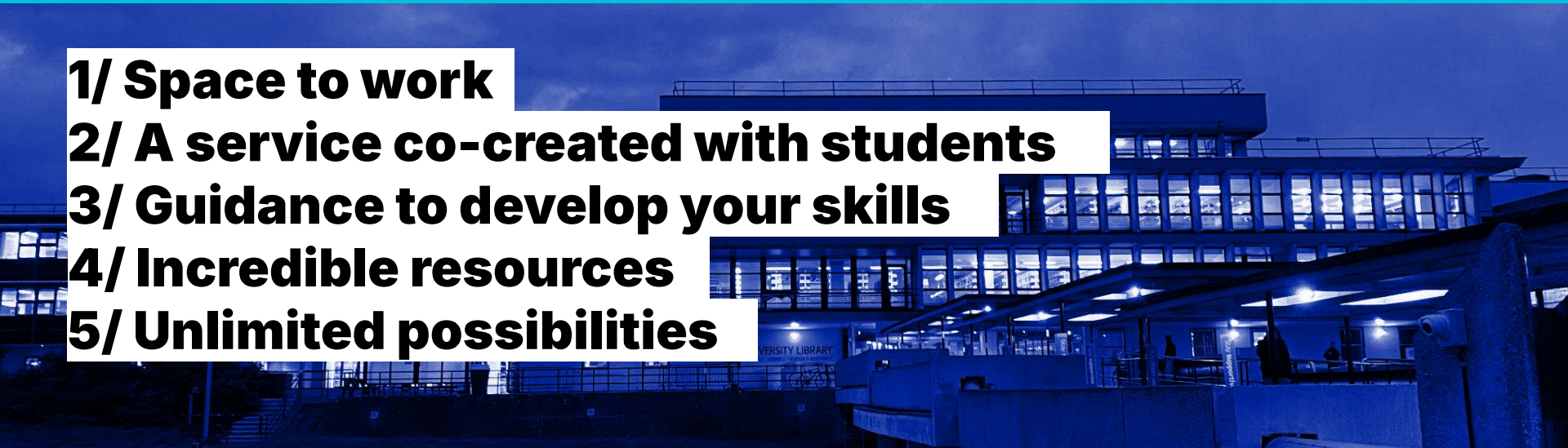
