1. The UK government is proposing to allow commercial planting of genetically modified crops. Will the use of civil disobedience by groups opposed to planting of genetically modified crops be justified?
2. Should sport fishing be banned in the UK?
3. There are about 25 terrestrial biodiversity "hotspots" on the planet. These 25 biodiversity hotspots contain 44 percent of all plant species and 35 percent of all terrestrial vertebrate species in only 1.4 percent of the planet's land area. Many of them are in developing countries. Should these hotspots be given over entirely to conservation with all human economic activity that might affect biodiversity banned?
