
Worldwide 346 million people have diabetes

World Health Organisation









In 2010 the estimated prevalence of diagnosed and undiagnosed diabetes in adults in Yorkshire and the Humber was 7.5%

APHO Diabetes Prevalence Model









A 45 year old woman diagnosed with diabetes has a life expectancy 20 years lower than all women of the same age

UK Prospective Diabetes Study









By 2030 the prevalence of diabetes in adults across

Yorkshire and the Humber is

estimated to rise to 9.5%

APHO Diabetes Prevalence Model









Globally around 3.2 million deaths every year are attributable to complications of diabetes; six deaths every minute.

In England about 12% of deaths between 20 and 79 years are due to diabetes

Neuropathy affects 60% - 70% of people with diabetes

In 2010/11, diabetic prescriptions in England cost £725.1 million (11.7% rise in net ingredient cost since 2009/10)


















The prevalence of chronic kidney disease resulting from diabetes, varies from 18% to over 30% in all people with diabetes






37.1% of audited inpatients with diabetes experienced at least one medication error









31.0% of audited sites had no inpatient diabetes specialist nurses









Only 12.9% of patients had definitely been involved in designing a treatment or care plan









15.9% of audited inpatients with diabetes had to have food brought in to hospital to meet their needs









People living in the 20% most deprived neighbourhoods in England are 56% more likely to have diabetes than those living in the least deprived areas

Diabetes Community Health Profiles









Patients with medication errors had twice the rate of severe hypoglycaemia (18.1 vs. 7.9%)









Inpatients reporting poor meal timing or choice were more likely to have a severe hypoglycaemic episode









Insulin errors were more common than errors with use of oral hypoglycaemic agents
