## ADRN and UK LS


- ADRN linking administrative and potentially census data – 100% of populations

  - Data limited to that asked
- ▶ UK LS 40 years of follow-up of samples
  - ~ 300,000 500,000
    - Census, vital registration, education
    - **Households**

## Example Event History of a Female LS Member aged 21 at 1991 Census



Example Event History of a Female LS Member aged 21 at 1991 Census




Travels to work by bike a journey of 2 miles





# Key Features of Longitudinal Change

- Comparison of same group over time (Age effects)
- Comparisons over time (Period comparisons)
- Comparisons between cohorts over time (Cohort effects)







- Ethical review, privacy assessment, feasibility, public benefit & scientific merit
- Approvals Panel of independent experts
- Accreditation and training
- Negotiation for permission to access & link
- Linkage via Trusted Third Party
- Analysis in a secure environment
- Results of analyses checked before released
- Plain English summaries of research published
