Conference Objectives

This conference brings together researchers and those interested in using research evidence to inform the design, delivery and evaluation of services for children and young people with life-limiting conditions and their families. The aims of the conference are

- to offer an overview of current and recently completed UK research within the field;
- to consider the implications of those findings for service design and/or practice;
- to develop delegates' knowledge and understanding of PPI across the research process;
- to provide a forum for connection and exchange between the research and practitioner/provider communities.
