<p>Assessment Guidance</p> <p><u>Assignment Title</u> You are required to write an essay which demonstrates how you contributed to the management of risks identified in a risk assessment which aimed to minimise potential harm to patients/clients, family, carers and staff in a particular environment. You are advised to negotiate and agree the risk assessment that will be the focus of your essay with your practice assessor.</p> <p><u>Assignment Guidance</u> Your essay should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Explain the relevant professional literature and regulations in relation to the risk assessment that was undertaken. Discuss who was at risk, the hazards they were exposed to, and the level of risk the hazard(s) posed. ● Examine what precautions were already in place, identifying and justifying the additional actions you and your practice assessor took to reduce the risk. ● Discuss the significance of accurate record keeping and regular monitoring in risk management, and the legal duty healthcare staff have when things go wrong. ● Analyse your contribution within your role to risk management and identify how you could improve your performance in future. ● Submit your risk assessment along with your essay. <p><u>Formative Support</u> To assist you in developing your essay, you will have opportunity to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Discuss, negotiate and agree a suitable area for risk assessment with your Practice Assessor. ● Undertake the different elements of the risk assessment in practice. ● Submit and receive feedback on a 500 word essay draft, outline or plan.
