Assignment Title

How in your Nursing Associate role you can work in partnership to support integrated care to improve the outcomes of care for individuals in line with the NMC standards for proficiency (2018).			
Assessment Guidance			
Professional discussion: Your examiner will ask you a series of hypothetical questions based on the NMC Nursing Associate Standards for Proficiency platforms 1 - 6. In responding to the questions, you are expected to draw upon the content of your theoretical modules and NAPAD 1 & 2 and critically analyse the knowledge, skills and behaviours you would demonstrate.
