<b>Assessment Guidance</b>			
<b>Formative</b>			
The formative assessment for this module is a 'practice' or 'mock' Observed Simulated Clinical Examination (OSCE). It will last for 15 minutes and be carried out by one examiner. Verbal feedback will be given immediately afterwards.			
<b>Summative</b>			
The summative assessment for this module is a structured OSCE. The OSCE will assess students' responses to simulated obstetric emergencies and rationale for their actions taken. As such the assessment relates to all the module learning outcomes.			
Therefore, you should: apply theoretical principles to the management of emergencies, be aware of their professional responsibility with reference to the multi-disciplinary team, address psychological issues during the simulation, make safe clinical judgements and demonstrate appropriate clinical skills and action planning.			
You will be assessed on two of the following emergency situations:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Antepartum haemorrhage</li> <li>• Postpartum haemorrhage</li> <li>• Cord prolapse</li> <li>• Pre-eclampsia and eclamptic fit</li> <li>• Undiagnosed breech presentation</li> <li>• Shoulder dystocia</li> <li>• Neonatal resuscitation</li> <li>• Maternal collapse</li> </ul>			
Part 1 will be an unseen scenario based on an emergency situation			
Part 2 will be questions based on a second unseen emergency scenario			
The OSCE will last for 30 minutes. You will be advised when there is 10 minutes left of the 30 minute time period.			
You will enter the exam room individually and will be given the scenario/clinical questions orally. You will then respond to the questions posed and demonstrate clinical skills as directed.			

Due to the nature of the assessment for this module the university's anonymous marking policy does not apply as this is an oral assessment. Students should identify themselves at the start of the OSCE for the audio-visual recording

Students are required to pass the OSCE. The OSCE will be graded using a marking grid for the specific emergencies. If practice is deemed unsafe, this would constitute a fail.

The OSCE will be recorded audio-visually and files uploaded to a secure location in order for the assessment to be moderated and assessed by the external examiner if they are unable to attend the assessment.

The OSCE will be performed using models/manikins and relevant equipment. The moderator and/or external examiner may be present for some of the assessments, but will be asked to review the recordings if they are not present for OSCES that require moderation according to normal university criteria.
