Assessment Guidance

Formative Assessment

Draft proposal of critical argument regarding the future of nursing as a profession, presented for discussion with peers.

Summative Assessment

You are required to articulate your position on Nursing as a profession. Taking into account patient needs and expectations, political drivers, other healthcare roles and other factors you feel are pertinent, present an argument to support your position, which considers the future of the profession and factors impacting upon this. You should conclude with a recommendation based on what you have learned.

- A 20 minute presentation on a defined area relevant to your future as a nurse, with 5 minutes for questions.
- You may use a maximum of 4 power point slides. Your slides must be submitted as an appendix to the written supporting statement.
- In advance of the presentation, you are required to submit your outline notes **and** presentation slides by the published date in your assessment schedule. You should identify the main points of your presentation and argument and include the key resources you have used to inform your position.
- Your written outline will not be part of the assessed work, it is there as a guide for examiners. However, your oral presentation should not include information not alluded to in your submitted paperwork.
- Sources cited must be referenced correctly.
- Cue cards may be used in the presentation as aide-memoir.

In advance of the presentation date, you are required to submit your outline notes and presentation slides. Please submit one electronic copy. If you do not submit your notes and slides by the published date your overall module mark will be subject to standard University penalties for late submission of assessments.

The assessment will meet all of the learning outcomes for this module and the student will:

- Demonstrate an understanding of the key differences between level 6 and level 7 study.
- Appreciate and understand the importance of self-directed inquiry.
- Demonstrate deeper understanding and awareness of methodology
- Engage with and articulate competing arguments both verbally and in writing, through enhanced methodological awareness.
- Present a persuasive argument to a range of people including clinicians, clients and their families.
