Assessment Guidance

Assessment title

You are required to undertake a field of practice specific 20-minute OSCE to assess your knowledge and application of consultation skills, history-taking and physical assessment skills. This will be followed by a 10-minute viva where you will be questioned on your clinical decision making.

Summative assessment guidance

Part 1 - OSCE

You are required to undertake an OSCE. You should demonstrate/consider the following:

- Use an appropriate framework to structure your consultation
- Obtain a focused history relevant to the history of presenting complaint
- Discuss the relevant physical and (or) mental health examination
- Consider the differential diagnoses based on the history of the presenting complaint and the clinical examination (subjective and objective data). Consideration must be given to any 'red flags'
- You will be required to formulate a clinical management plan, attend to safety netting, and closing the consultation
- NB failure to achieve all the OSCE starred (*) criteria will result in a fail.

Part 2 – Professional discussion

• Following the OSCE you will actively participate in a 10-minute professional discussion where you will be asked questions on your performance and the evidence base that informed your decision making.

Formative support

To help prepare you for your OSCE, you will have the opportunity to:

- Participate in consultation skills practice and receive feedback from your peers and the seminar lead
- Complete formative clinical case scenarios during the seminars
- Apply the consultation and clinical assessment skills to clinical practice (Nursing Practice Two)
- Undertake a formative OSCE and professional discussion, and receive verbal feedback from the examiner
