Assessment Guidance			
<u>Assessment Title</u>			
An oral presentation which focuses upon critically analysing evidence from the literature to show understanding of what health means to a person, how perceptions of health may be psychosocially constructed, and what this means for nurses and nursing practice.			
<u>Assessment Guidance</u>			
15-minute oral presentation (PowerPoint - maximum of 5 slides + 1 for references).			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Select an individual to be the focus of the assessment. The individual may be a family member, a friend, or someone that you have met in a professional capacity. Ensure that confidentiality is maintained throughout your work. ● Begin the presentation with a brief outline of the individual. This should include information about the person's health status – both real and perceived, how they would define or perceive health and how their perception of health has, or may, impact upon them. ● Next, draw upon evidence from the literature, including relevant psychological and sociological theories, to attempt to explain the individual's perception of health. <i>Why does the individual define health as they do? What factors impact upon their perception of health?</i> Critically analyse your findings from the literature in order to explore and explain how a person's perception of health is psychosocially constructed. ● Consider the relevance to nursing of understanding individual people's perceptions of health. ● Discuss the different forms of evidence and information that guide perceptions of health and inform nursing practice. 			
<u>Summative PowerPoint presentation</u>			
It is a requirement that in advance of the presentation dates, you submit your PowerPoint presentation. If you do not submit your presentation paperwork by the published date your overall module mark will be subject to standard University penalties for late submission of assessments.
