Assessment Guidance

Formative assessment

You will be given the opportunity to undertake observed practice of all skills and history taking during the taught time. Feedback will be given by both peers and academic staff to support your development throughout.

There will also be formative online exams which link to supporting you to develop your underpinning knowledge.

Summative assessment

You will undertake 4 stations using the Observed Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) approach. Each station is 30 minutes in length. These will be unseen and the physical assessment stations will be drawn from the physical skills taught within the module.

Each station will be marked out of 100% with a pass mark of 70% and you must also achieve those criteria which are considered as safety issues (these will be indicated on the assessment sheets). If you fail to achieve the safety criteria or your practice is unsafe you will not pass the OSCE station.

If you do not pass a station you will be required to resit that station only.

The outcome will be recorded as pass or fail.
