Your essay will include a background to the situation and then critical analysis of the various aspects that would influence any humanitarian response. The essay will conclude with a set of criteria or recommendations that need to be incorporated or considered in implementing any humanitarian response.</p> <p>Your essay should demonstrate thorough reading and engagement with the course material.
