<b>Assessment Guidance</b>			
You are required to submit a grant application for a project to address a specific global public health issue using the provided template. All submissions must be cited and referenced in the normal way.			
<b>Formative assessment</b>			
In the formative assessment you will submit a plan for your summative assessment. You will apply the learning from the module to address a specific global public health issue in a particular country context (not your own). You will be asked to prepare a 100 word plan for your funding proposal. You will receive individual written feedback to help you to develop and finalise your summative assessment.			
You will be expected to cover the following points in your summary:			
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Brief rationale for selecting the global public health issue in question</li> <li>2. Propose what public health strategy you would like to implement to address this problem with a clear justification for your approach (based on evidence)</li> <li>3. Consider the expected impact of the proposed public health strategy/strategies and how this will be measured</li> </ol>			
<b>Summative assessment</b>			
For the summative assessment, you will demonstrate how well you can apply your learning from the module to address a specific global public health issue in a particular country context (see scenario below).			
You will be required to submit a grant application to address the issue you have identified in the specific country of your choice (not your own country).			
The scenario is as follows:			
“You are expected to write a grant application on behalf of an international non-governmental organisation X working in a country Y to address a specific global public health issue. Organisation X works closely with the government, WHO and other non-governmental organisations interested in addressing the issue. You have been alerted to a new funding stream to prevent and control a number of priority health problems. The aim is to expedite country Y’s progress towards the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) targets.”			
Your organisation X can bid for £500,000 for three years on one project addressing one of these priorities.			

The application should be limited to a maximum of 2,500 words excluding any references (including in-text references), tables and charts.

Please use Arial 12 point font throughout and double spacing.

You can include a maximum of two tables and two charts (one of which will be a Gantt chart). The charts can be used, for example, to visually illustrate the epidemiology of the problem you are trying to address. The tables can be used to complement your stakeholder identification/activities or implementation plan and measures of success.

You should also include a project budget (as a table; this will not be included in the word count).

For the tables and budget you can use Arial 10 point font.

You will use the application form template to structure your grant proposal (see below). Each sub-section on the form will have a fixed word limit. Please provide your word count for each subsection, do not exceed the word limit prescribed for each subsection.

A systematic and critical approach will be expected and the application should include a justification for the proposal. It is important that the arguments presented in the application are supported by evidence, which should be clearly and accurately referenced. Students will be expected to refer to the student handbook which outlines the departmental preferred referencing style, assessment strategy and expectations.

Consider:

1. What country are you going to choose?
2. What issue needs to be addressed and why now?
3. What is the context currently in the country you have chosen? (Make sure you include published evidence on the topic and context)
4. What change/service/policy/intervention are you advocating? (Be specific and make sure that you have thought it out thoroughly. You might use evidence from other countries about what has worked elsewhere)
