<p><b>Assessment Guidance</b></p> <p><b>Formative assessment</b></p> <p>The formative assessment will be a short multi-choice test with feedback. Questions will include calculations and ensure knowledge of the key concepts taught on the course. The test is designed to prepare students for the summative assessment at the end of the course.</p> <p><b>Summative assessment</b></p> <p>This module will be assessed by a Specific Timeframe Open Exam. Total exam time is 3 hours. It is anticipated this examination should take 2 hours with one hour for upload.</p> <p>The exam will consist of two sections.</p> <p>Section A will be <b>short answer questions</b>, with calculations required in some cases. All questions must be answered and no choices are available in Section A. Working must be shown for data-based questions. [Section A will contribute <b>50%</b> of the final mark]</p> <p>Section B will be <b>one essay</b> from a choice of two questions. [Section B will contribute <b>50%</b> of the final mark].</p> <p>Students are expected to draw upon the course material and required to answer the essay question using economic analysis to illustrate the issues raised. Students will be expected to demonstrate an awareness of how health economics can help understand policy related issues. Students are encouraged to present analysis in a diagrammatic form where relevant, with accompanying explanations of any diagrams used.</p> <p>A <b>1,000 word limit</b> will apply for the essay.</p>
