<p>Assessment Guidance You are required to complete your literature review through consideration of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introduction - choose a group of people with particular complex needs relevant to your Field of Practice. • Search strategy - undertake and detail a systematic approach to your literature search with the aim of identifying different types of literature relevant to your chosen area of complex clinical needs (e.g. research literature, health policy, professional standards, and clinical guidelines). • Analysis and findings – critically analyse the literature, synthesise, and discuss your findings. • Recommendations for practice – use the findings of your literature review to develop recommendations for practice.
