Assessment Guidance

Formative Assessment

Part 1 – Objective Structured Clinical Examination [OSCE]

Given the current situation, there will be no formal formative OSCE. However, it is advised that you practice your clinical examination skills against the OSCE criteria on colleagues at work or friends/relatives that you live with, whilst not breaching the social distancing [advice given by the Government](#).

Summative Assessment

Part 1 – Objective Structured Clinical Examination [OSCE] (in Clinical Practice)

The student will be emailed 3 OSCE criteria, comprising of consultation and history taking along with patient history brief (script for the simulated patient to learn), and two further clinical examination OSCE sheets (like the ones used in class). Each student is required to identify a Nominated Registrant Assessor that is **appropriately qualified** and is willing to assess you.

The OSCEs will assess consultation skills, safety and competence in the principles and practice of physical examination appropriate to minor injuries. All the starred (*) criteria must be achieved and the overall pass mark for each OSCE is 75%. This is marked as **pass/fail** and will be calculated by the module leader.

Consultation OSCE (suggested time of 15 minutes)

You will need a willing volunteer [a colleague] to act as the '*simulated patient*' and 'learn' the salient points documented on the patient history briefing sheet (emailed to you with the OSCE criteria). The Nominated Registrant Assessor will use the *Consultation and History Taking OSCE Criteria* mark sheet to assess you. Once completed, it will need to be emailed to the DoHS examination office dohs-assessments@york.ac.uk (a copy or photograph of all pages will suffice) before the deadline stipulated on the assessment schedule. **As a registrant, the University of York expect that you will exercise probity when completing this assessment.**

Clinical Examination OSCEs (suggested time of 15 minutes per limb)

You will need a willing volunteer [a colleague] to act as the *'simulated patient'*. The Nominated Registrant Assessor will use the *Clinical Examination OSCE Criteria* mark sheet to assess you. Once completed, all paperwork will need to be emailed to the DoHS examination office dohs-assessments@york.ac.uk (a copy or photograph of all pages will suffice) before the deadline stipulated on the assessment schedule. **As a registrant, the University of York expect that you will exercise probity when completing this assessment.**

Please note, the OSCEs can be completed in one sitting or separated over several days/weeks. Each student will need to decide what will work best, based on service provision and access to a Nominated Registrant Assessor(s).

Part 2 – 24-hour Open Book Examination (completion time 90 minutes)

The online 24-hour open book examination will assess a broad range of knowledge taken from the module content using short answer questions. This paper will provide the overall percentage mark awarded for the module.
