## Find books in the Library with ease



With more than a million books on our shelves, there's a world of knowledge to explore in the University Library. This guide will help you to find the books that you need.



## Step 1

Search for the book you need on YorSearch, the library catalogue.

## Step 3

Find the book on the shelf, then borrow it using one of our self-issue machines. You'll need your Student Card or the MyUoY app.

## Step 2

Check the entry in YorSearch for the shelf location.
This is a code starting with a letter or letters, such as: **D 1.15 HOG** 

Here's what each part of the shelf location means:

**D** is for the Sociology section, on Morrell Floor 1 **1.15** is the subject classification, in this case Social Psychology

**HOG** comes from the author's name, helping you to find the exact book on the shelves

If you see the word **Quarto** before the shelf location, you'll need the section for larger books in that subject.

We arrange all the books in the Library by subject, so you might like to browse for other useful books at the same shelf location. Remember that some books might be on loan or we'll have them as an ebook; you can also browse electronically on YorSearch to see our full range of titles.
