Update from the Dean



So, what has been happening in PGR-world in the last few weeks? Well, UKRI have released their response to the call for input on the New Deal for PG research. In a nutshell, - nothing unexpected or headline grabbing (in my view). UKRI funds about 20% of our PGRs at York - and the good news is that they are very committed to investing in training the next generation of researchers. The UKRI basic stipend has risen 20% over the last couple of years. Plus, they are looking to review stipends again especially for PGRs with caring responsibilities or disabilities, though there is no clear timeframe for this. If you do find yourself struggling, you can see details of our cost of living support for students on the website.

Perhaps more contentious (for some) is the debate over whether PGRs should be considered as staff rather than students (see also a <u>WonkHE article</u> by YUSU's CEO). No change to this is planned, but both UKRI and York are looking at how we can ensure that you are aware of your current rights (e.g. to <u>sick leave</u>) and how we can better support you. Expect further announcements from us over the coming months.

The New Deal report did reference a new project that has been awarded to someone who will be familiar to those who have done <u>researcher training with BRIC</u>. The marvellous Dr Karen Clegg has been awarded funding for a <u>culture-change project called RSVP</u> on research supervision involving over 20 universities and over 400 doctoral students. This, along with our <u>YCEDE</u> project working to widen access to PGR for ethnically minoritised applicants, means that York now has become a national focus for research into PGR policy and support. YGRS will be ensuring that York's PGRs and supervisors benefit from these high profile projects.

It was amazing to welcome ~200 new PGRs to York at the <u>YGRS induction</u> on 4 October. The event had a real buzz about it. The best bit (apart from the cake and plants!) was talking to new PGRs about their planned projects - such an interesting group of people and great ambassadors for their disciplines.

We are also marking <u>Black History Month</u>. Our Chair of YCEDE's external Advisory Board, Ayo Barley, has written a blog on <u>Why Black Women need recognition all year round</u>. York has been running lots of events, too.

Finally, you might have seen the announcement that <u>York is proud to have been awarded Gold in the Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF)</u>. York's delivery of amazing teaching would not be possible without you - our PGR community - who have worked tirelessly throughout some challenging years. So, many thanks on behalf of the University to all of you who are Graduate Teaching Assistants (GTAs)!
