

Want to spend 3 months working in Westminster?

The Parliamentary Office for Science and Technology (POST) currently runs a Policy Internship Scheme, which is a competitive process available to doctoral students to apply for a 3-month placement to POST to gain valuable policy experience.

N8 AgriFood is funding an internship in collaboration with POST to begin in January 2020.

The successful candidate will work at POST (Houses of Parliament, Westminster) for 3 months to produce a POSTnote or POSTbrief, from start to finish. This includes scoping the topic, conducting interviews with senior stakeholders from across academia, government, industry and the not-for-profit sector, then drafting, editing and finalising the document.

By the end of your time at POST, you will have learnt how to write for policy makers with balance, impartiality and succinctness. You will have developed a unique understanding of Westminster, forged important relationships with key stakeholders, and delved into a novel and exciting topic of research.

- Influence the design and delivery of more robust certification schemes that promote a sustainable food system.
- Provide more accurate information on the global impacts of our food choices on people and planet.
