The process and planning work for this is underway and it is expected that the necessary legislation will be brought before parliament in approximately 18 months. Until then the Physician Associate Managed Voluntary Register (PAMVR) is held by the Faculty of Physician Associates (FPA) (the professional membership body that supports PA's in the UK) and provides details of fully qualified and approved PA's. The PAMVR was established in June 2010 to provide public protection and safety, set standards for post graduate education and development, and to advance towards statutory regulation.		The FPA and the PA Schools Council (the body representing PA schools across the UK) are developing standards and processes for accreditation of PA programmes and it is expected that preliminary requirements will be published in 2020. It is expected that the FPA will initially perform accreditation visits and will classify PA programmes as "pending accreditation", subject to more formal review by the GMC as the new regulating body. Hull York Medical School is a member of the PA Schools Council and will seek accreditation of our programme at the earlier opportunity once the formal process is established.

Subject to approval, the BSB's only regulatory involvement in undergraduate law degrees or CPE courses (ie Graduate Diploma in Law) which will start in or after academic year 2019/20 will be the continuing requirements that law degrees are compliant with the QAA subject benchmark statement for law and that degree courses contain the seven "Foundations of Legal Knowledge" subjects as well as the skills associated with graduate legal work such as legal research.  Please be aware that the seven "foundations of legal knowledge" subjects are not always a compulsory element of pure law or mixed law degree programmes. However, the foundations of legal knowledge subjects remain compulsory for all students who wish to be called to the Bar and practise as a barrister in England and Wales. It will be the responsibility of Authorised Education and Training Organisations (AETOs) to ensure compliance with these arrangements.  6. The SRA's future training arrangements For undergraduate law degree courses that start after the introduction of the SQE (autumn 2021), the current Joint Statement requirements will no longer apply. Under the proposed SQE, students will need to hold a degree or equivalent qualification or experience, but they will no longer need to study for a QLD or CPE recognised or approved by the SRA. The SRA will no longer specify the academic content of law degrees. However, the SQE will ask students to demonstrate the knowledge set out in the Statement of Legal Knowledge. This includes the seven foundations of legal knowledge subjects currently specified in the Joint Statement (in addition to other areas of law and practice)  The seven foundations of legal knowledge are Criminal Law, Equity and Trusts, Law of the European Union, Obligations 1 (Contract), Obligations 2 (Tort), Property/Land Law, Public Law (Constitutional Law, Administrative Law and Human Rights Law). Subject to the United Kingdom's withdrawal from the European Union and/or any agreement made on European Law in future, European Law will continue as one of the foundation subjects for the foreseeable future.
