


Things to do first

When your place is confirmed, we send joining instructions to your personal email account. This contains your University of York username and password.

1. Set up your University IT accounts

- Set up your IT account and security questions in Identity Manager: idm.york.ac.uk
- Set up Duo two-factor authentication in order to access key systems such as eVision and the VLE: york.ac.uk/it-services/services/duo
- Set up Google two-factor authentication in order to access your email and other Google services: york.ac.uk/it-services/google




Use your username and password to access your student record at evision.york.ac.uk and complete the enrolment tasks:

- Enrol
- · Upload your photo for your Uni card
- Upload proof of eligibility to study in the UK (including UK students)
- Set up direct debit payments for University accommodation and fees (if applicable)

3. Sort your accommodation

Apply for University accommodation, or accept your offer if you've pre-booked. Make sure you tell us on your application form if you have any additional requirements. If you are not applying for University accommodation, get help finding somewhere to live: york.ac.uk/study/accommodation/private-sector



4. Sort your finances

If you're applying for student finance, check you have returned the signed declaration.
