

# WRDTP Studentship Awards 2024/25 - call for nominations

The White Rose DTP is a regional consortium of seven universities with social science research excellence and involves the universities of Sheffield, Leeds and York as well as Bradford, Hull, Manchester Metropolitan and Sheffield Hallam. The WRDTP has been accredited by the ESRC to offer PhD scholarships across a range of schemes, and in 2024/25 the following awards will be open for application from students:

- up to 32 WRDTP Pathway Awards, incorporating 2 Interdisciplinary Research Awards and 2 WRDTP/Stuart Hall Foundation Awards for Black British applicants
- up to 2 WRDTP Advanced Quantitative Methods (AQM) Awards
- up to 2 WRDTP Advanced Data Analytics (ADA) Awards

There will also be up to 7 Collaborative Awards made to supervisory teams for projects involving collaboration with an external partner. Supervisors will apply for these awards, and those projects that are awarded funding will be open for applications from students in early Spring 2024. ### **Funding Available**

Each student will receive an annual stipend based on the ESRC's current <u>studentship rates</u>. In 2023/24, the annual stipend was £18,622. Updated rates will be published in early 2024. This will be paid for the duration of the funding period. Full home tuition fees will be paid for the duration of the funded period.

International candidates are welcome to apply to both the Pathway, AQM and ADA Award schemes (but please note that the Stuart Hall Foundation Awards are open to Black British applicants only).

The ESRC limits the proportion of awards available to international applicants to 30%, which means that the WRDTP cannot offer any more than 30% of its awards to international candidates. To manage this, each of the seven universities has a limit on the number of international applications that it puts forward to the WRDTP. If you are an international candidate, you should speak to your school or department to find out more about any selection processes that may be in place.

### Eligible schools/departments

The WRDTP comprises seven partner universities, and within each of these universities there are a number of departments or schools eligible to make studentship nominations. These are listed on our website. To be eligible for a WRDTP award, applicants must hold an offer for a PhD place in an eligible school or department, and must be intending to undertake a social sciences research project that is within the ESRC's remit.

### **Thematic Interdisciplinary Training Pathways**

Reflecting our emphasis on tackling the greatest challenges facing global society, the WRDTP is organised around seven Thematic Interdisciplinary Training Pathways. These are detailed in full on our <u>website</u>, and applications must be able to articulate their fit with at least one of the pathways.

# Stuart Hall Foundation Awards for Black British Applicants

The WRDTP is delighted to continue working with the Stuart Hall Foundation (SHF) to support two studentships for Black British applicants. The WRDTP is keen to address historic structural inequalities in education through its partnership with SHF, and welcomes applications from Black British applicants. # Process - Pathway/AQM/ADS Awards

The nomination process requires several pieces of documentation to be combined and submitted to the WRDTP as a single PDF document (this is referred to as the 'nomination pack'). Some of this documentation will be completed or provided by the applicant, and some will be completed by the supervisors and department/school. Applicants therefore should ensure that they allow sufficient time to liaise with potential supervisors in the relevant department or school:

- 1. WRDTP Studentship Application Form (completed by the applicant)
- 2. WRDTP Nomination Form (completed by the nominating university)
- 3. Copy of letter confirming place on the PhD in an eligible school or department
- 4. Degree transcripts. These should include details of the modules taken. Where applicants are currently studying for a degree, interim transcripts should be provided wherever possible.

The PDF file name must follow a specific nomenclature:

Surname Initial HEI Pathway competition e.g., Jones M Sheffield CEL AQM

The following table summarises the WRDTP's key dates and deadlines. Please note that applications are NOT submitted to the WRDTP directly. All applications are submitted to the relevant partner university who then makes a submission to the WRDTP.



Applicants must observe any processes or deadlines that the individual department, school or university has in place for assessing applications, so applicants are advised to make contact with their school or department at an early stage to discuss their application. Late applications are not accepted.

# **Additional Information for Supervisors and Nominating Universities**

### Studentship Match Funding

WRDTP awards are offered on either a fully funded (100% - AQM Awards, ADA Awards and Collaborative Awards) or match-funded (50% - Pathway Awards) basis. The table below shows the approximate value of full/match-funded studentships based on current rates for Home fees and the maintenance stipend (note: fees and stipend increase annually with new rates confirmed by UKRI in spring each year).

Please note that individual universities are required to 'top up' the difference between Home and International fees, and the ESRC limits the proportion of awards we can make to international applicants to 30% of the total number of awards per cohort. Schools/departments should speak to their institution's WRDTP AQC member(s) to confirm the process for nominating international candidates for a WRDTP studentship.

Universities are expected to have robust assessment processes in place to assess international candidates, which use the WRDTP's own assessment criteria for decision making.

### Additional training support funds:

The WRDTP holds the RTSG - **Research Training Support Grant**. Students can request RTSG funds to support their research activities and should apply directly to their HEI for funds. Typically, no more than £2,000 will be available per student over the lifetime of their PhD (funds are not available during the Masters year of a 1+3 award). These monies are not to be considered a



personal allowance but are pooled to allow for greater flexibility in meeting the needs of the student cohort as a whole.

# Process - Pathway, AQM, ADA Awards

Please ensure that any internal processes or deadlines are clearly communicated to applicants and are published on relevant webpages, e.g., PGR scholarship webpages.

### **Process and Timelines - Collaborative Awards**

Project supervisors are required to submit the following documentation in their application:

### • WRDTP Collaborative Award Proposal Form - online, via Google Form

All partner universities will run an internal process of peer review for the Collaborative Awards scheme, given the highly competitive nature of this competition. Details of the internal review process will be announced locally by each university. When submitting a collaborative award application, you will be required to confirm that your application has been subjected to internal peer review at your own university. Failure to engage with the internal peer review process may result in the disqualification of your application.
