Project Title	Characterising Symptoms of Parkinson's Disease by Analysing Optical Flow in Video using Evolutionary Algorithms
Project Description	Parkinson's disease is a chronic debilitating neurodegenerative disease that affects approximately 1 in 500 people. Two symptoms of Parkinson's disease are tremor and a slowing of movement called <i>bradykinesia</i> , which can be difficult to measure with confidence. This project will investigate the use of evolutionary algorithms for assessing these symptoms from video sequences of zebrafish with the disease. The video will be preprocessed using functions from the OpenCV computer vision library and extracted features then used to train the evolutionary algorithms to recognise the symptoms of interest.
Required skills	An interest in computer vision and good programming skills in either Java or C languages.
