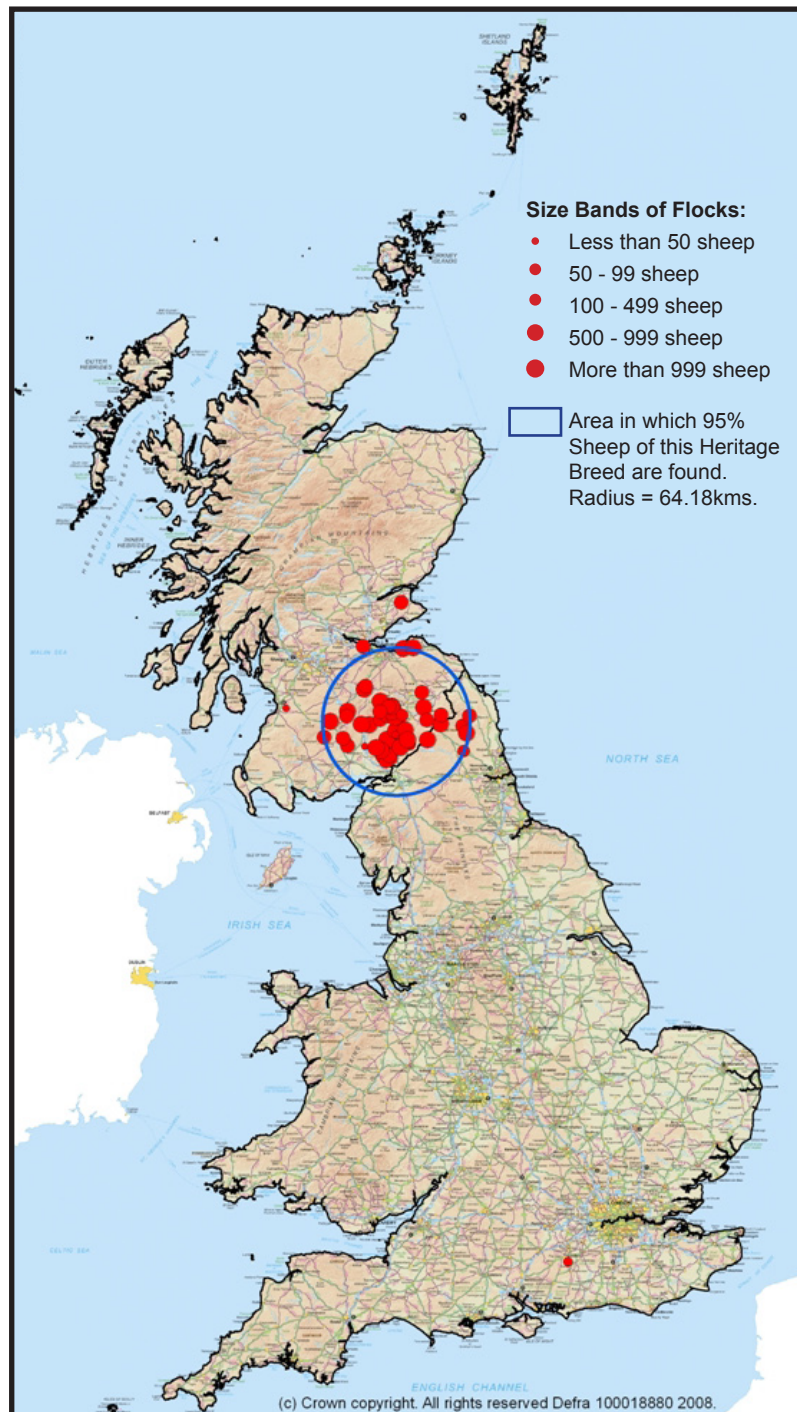


## The South Country Cheviot Heritage Sheep Breed



The Sheep Trust presented a report to the National Standing Committee on Farm Animal Genetic Resources in March 2009, providing the first robust evidence to demonstrate geographical concentration of the South Country Cheviot breed.
