Decision making



Decisions are multifaceted and complex

Most women integrate decisions about HRT with their lives in general

Most women will find the right time for them for their own decision









Decision making



For some women taking HRT has an important role in maintaining their sense of control over their own bodies and their health and health care

Dominance of technology

A test such as bone densitometry can dominate a consultation and decision making

The technological test result becomes a certainty









Uncertainty



Medical evidence such as the risk of breast cancer from HRT comes from population studies

We cannot know which woman will get breast cancer because she took HRT









Uncertainty



Avoid creating a sense of certainty from what is by its nature uncertain

Negotiate a provisional decision with each woman. Review it as planned
